Pope Leo XIV General Audience September 2, 2026

Dear brothers and sisters, in our continuing series of catechesis on the documents of the Second Vatican Council, today we begin our reflection on the Pastoral Constitution *Gaudium et Spes*. This Document focuses on the Church's pastoral responsibility to engage with the contemporary world, sharing in its joys and sorrows, and calls for a commitment to conversion, bearing witness to Christ's work, and advocating for the poor and marginalized. The Church is also to be attentive to the signs of the times, interpreting them in the light of the Gospel, thereby addressing pressing issues such as the technological progress that benefits only some and the persistence of widespread poverty. In our own day, marked by profound change and much injustice, each of us, then, is called to play our part in welcoming and listening to the deepest questions and longings of the human heart, making present to all the merciful love of Christ our Savior.

Reflection on Matthew 18:15-20

Jesus' teaching in this passage is strikingly practical. He doesn't speak in lofty abstractions about forgiveness; He gives us a step-by-step path for healing broken relationships. The first step is simple but challenging: **go directly to the person who has hurt you**. Not to vent to others, not to withdraw in silence, but to speak honestly and gently to the one involved. This protects the dignity of both people and keeps the community from unnecessary division.

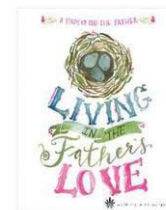
If that first conversation fails, Jesus encourages persistence—not in anger, but in love. Bringing others into the conversation is not about building a case; it is about widening the circle of grace. The goal is always the same: **to win back a brother or sister**, not to prove ourselves right.

Then Jesus reveals something profound: **our efforts at reconciliation are places where God acts**. "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them." Healing relationships is not merely human work; it is divine work. Christ stands in the middle of every attempt at peace, strengthening our courage, softening our hearts, and guiding our words.

In a world that often chooses avoidance, outrage, or public shaming, Matthew 18 calls us to a different way—the way of patient dialogue, humility, and mercy. When we seek reconciliation, we become instruments of Christ's presence. And even when the process is slow or imperfect, grace is at work.

As someone who works in the field of conflict management, I like to think that all situations can be worked out if we go about it in a skilled manner. If we use the right words. Ask the right kinds of questions. It's embarrassing to admit that even the best "tools" in my "conflict belt" sometimes still effect little change. Today's gospel can be consoling in a strange way. It acknowledges that even when we use all the tools we have on hand to heal a relationship, it doesn't always work out. Sometimes, we may need to become strangers to one another, at least for a while—like a Jew to a Gentile or a tax collector.

Of course, when Jesus says "treat him as you would a Gentile or a tax collector," it is important to consider how Jesus treated Gentiles and tax collectors. He healed the centurion's servant. He ate in Zacchaeus' house. Jesus did not see Gentiles and tax collectors as enemies and did not treat them as such. Rather, Jesus understood Gentiles and tax collectors as those with whom he might start a relationship should the opportunity present itself. The past cannot be rewritten, but perhaps a different kind of future is still possible.

Is there a relationship in your life that feels beyond healing at this point and from which perhaps you need some distance? Is it still possible to treat the other person with the kindness Jesus showed toward Gentiles and tax collectors? •
