Dear Padre.

Is envy a sin? I find myself becoming very envious of people who have more than I do. I find it difficult to be content with what my family and I have now.

We live in a climate that encourages discontent with what we have. Advertising plays on our feelings of envy and our desire for possessions. In this almost universal rush to possess more and better material objects, Christians are called to a counterwitness. We are called to embrace a freedom and a poverty of spirit that actually rejoices in the blessings of others.



The Tenth Commandment alerts us to the danger of undisciplined envy: "You shall not covet...anything that belongs to your neighbor" (Exodus 20:17). In the New Testament, Jesus says that where our treasure is, there also will be our heart. (See Matthew 6:21.) The real antidote to envy, then, is prayers of thanks for all God has given to us and others. To feel envious, to desire or covet someone else's possessions, is not in itself a mortal sin. But to let that feeling invade your mind, to indulge it and rationalize it, is to let that feeling harden into an envious frame of mind. Then you are flirting with real sin. The grave sin is to allow these envious thoughts to drive you to any injustice or evil. The Catechism of the Catholic Church sums it up well: "Would you like to see God glorified by you? Then rejoice in your brother's [and sister's] progress, and you will immediately give glory to God" (2540).



Childhood daydreams come peppered with visions of heroes and heroines, movie stars and rock stars, fame and notoriety. Eventually, however, we adjust our visions of what we can become as we are confronted by the reality of who we are. Seldom, however, are our daydreams and visions big enough. They tend to be only about ourselves, barely including others.

The same may be said about becoming people of faith. Too readily we think of faith simply as our personal decision to believe in God. Faith then becomes one-sided—the prayers we say, the Masses we attend, the Church's rules we obey. Like the people of the prophet Habakkuk's day, we may bemoan, "I cry for help and you do not listen.... [I] cry out to you, 'Violence!' and you do not intervene" (Habakkuk 1:2).

Then, too, our faith and its vision for life are not big enough, for we do not allow room for God to slip into our lives and do what God does. Then, faith is only about ourselves—our needs and struggles and pains. Faith needs to be a surrender to God's vision, not simply for ourselves, but for all of life. [The LORD said,] "The vision is a witness for the appointed time…it will not disappoint. If it delays, wait for it, it will surely come, it will not be late" (Habakkuk 2:3). The difficulty is that we want God to make life perfect for us the way we want it and when we want it. Then, it becomes our vision for life and not God's. ●

CARLOS ACUTIS DISPLAY

Come and join us on Oct. 18th before 4 p.m. mass at St. James starting at 2 p.m. and will continue on after mass and on Oct. 19th at St. Joachim before 10 a.m. mass starting at 8 a.m. and will continue on after mass in the IWC.

Carlos Acutis was born in London, England on May 3, 1991, to Italian parents who were working there at the time. They later moved to Milan, Italy, where he spent the rest of his life until his death at the age of 15. He died October 12, 2006, of a rare form of Leukemia. This young man started talking at a very young age and was so close to God. He went to Church every day and said the rosary. He used Technology to spread his faith and warned the younger generation about the dangers of the internet. He earned the nickname of "God's Influencer". He catalog all the authenticated Eucharistic miracles of the world. One of his words of wisdom "All people are born as originals but many die as photocopies." He understood that God made us each unique and that we use our own individual talents that God has given us. We were not all born to be the same. Pope Francis said "He saw that many young people, wanting to be different, really end up being like everyone else, running after whatever the powerful set before them with the mechanisms of consumerisms and distraction. In this way they do not bring forth the gifts the Lord has given them; they do not offer the world those unique personal talents that God has given to each of them. Don't let that happen to you! (Christus Vivit 106)" The most important thing about Carlos is his love for the Eucharist. He said, "the Eucharist Is my highway to Heaven." He then created a website documenting all the Eucharistic miracles around the world, some will be present.

There will be a first class relic of Sts. Joachim and Anne and a second class relic of the Blessed Mother & St. Joseph. A first-class Relic is a body part of a saint or a fragment of the true Cross of Christ, while a second-class relic is a personal possession of a saint such as an item of their clothing or a book they owned. You can bring a rosary, medal, or any sacred item and touch them to the first-class and second-class relics and this will then make your item become third-class relics. Along with these relics, we will have pictures of the new saint and Eucharist Miracle.
