
Dear Padre,

I am a practicing Catholic and I don't remember being confirmed. Is it too late for me to be confirmed?

The sacrament of confirmation usually happens when a person is older, and therefore you would likely remember the occasion. It could be that you were not confirmed. You can check with the parish you lived in during your school years to be sure. They keep records of confirmations done in the parish.

Confirmation is the final sacrament of initiation. Baptism ushers us into our life with God by giving us new life. Confirmation seals us with the spirit so we can follow Jesus and live out our



particular vocation. And the Eucharist gives us strength for the journey and keeps us in union with God.

If you discover you have not been confirmed or if you can't find out for certain, talk with your pastor. You would not be the first adult seeking confirmation. Your pastor can tell you how your diocese handles confirmation for adults. There might be a program of adult instruction for confirmation to ensure you understand the sacrament and the teachings of the Church.

Today is Pentecost, the day when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit into the lives of the apostles. The Spirit gave them strength for what they had to do. The Spirit can do the same for you.



ear can be a most powerful imprisoning force. Like the apostles who locked themselves behind closed doors after the resurrection for fear of the local leaders, there are times when our own fears lock us out of the future and into our past.

We find ourselves choosing not to be generous for fear that if we are, we will find ourselves empty-handed with no one to care for us because all of our resources have been used up. And so, because of our fear, we lock ourselves into our own selfishness. At other times, we hesitate to be kind for fear that our care will be misconstrued or, worse, will be taken advantage of and abused. And so, for fear of continual demands upon our kindness, we lock ourselves into indifference. At other times, we find ourselves too cautious to speak out in the face of injustice because of a misguided respect

for "someone else's business" or because we are afraid anger or rejection will come down upon us. So, we lock ourselves into silence.

It is always the Spirit, however, that enables us to unlock those doors once locked by our fear. While that new power enables us to venture into a sometimesshattering world, it does not promise we won't be shattered in the process. All that Jesus promised is that the Spirit would bring us peace. Such peace happens to us whenever we choose not to succumb to our fears. It is indeed a new creation taking place in us, even now.


This year St. James will have our annual Fall PICNIC, Sunday, September 17th. All PSR Families are encouraged to volunteer to help in any way possible.

This encounter is a bit different.

I remember one of the most terrifying experiences in my life. When I was about 9 or 10, my sister had brought a Quiji Board game home and wanted my mother and older brother to play the game with her. Mom kept saying no, but she finally gave in. So the three of them sat down and pulled the game out and started asking it questions like: "will I ever get married? will we ever move?" simple yes or no questions. Well, my two brothers started bickering and mom sent them to their room. Meanwhile, mom and sister asked the game a few more simple questions. My older brother kept bugging mom. Finally mom got aggravated with him and said "What do you want!?" I will never forget what happened next.....the board spelled out....."Your Soul".

I also remember some of the conversation when that happened. "did you do that?, no, my hand wasn't even touching the board! And as they were trying to figure it out, the eye thing spelled it out again!

Well, that was enough for ALL of us! Mom told my sister to take that "evil thing" out to the trash. Not too much later, mom told my sister to go outside for something (can't remember what though), but when she did, as God is my witness, that quiji board was back at the back door of the house. So mom told my sister & older brother to go destroy it and dump it again. They took a hammer and busted the little triangle piece that you put your hands on into shreds and busted the board up then they dumbed it in the dumpster in alley.

We were ALL scared for our souls!!!. Not one of us could go to sleep that night. So we all gathered on the pull out sofa bed and we prayed our Rosary with all our mite until we finally fell asleep!

What should we take from this? For those out there that don't believe Satan is real in every evil thing out there, you better wake-up! Satan is real and he's working hard to get every soul he can. We NEED God's Holy Spirit and St. Michael the Archangel to protect us. We NEED Jesus in the Eucharist to fill our hearts & souls so there's no room for Satan. We need to open our eyes and see how Satan works in the "little things" in our lives like the decision you make to skip Sunday Mass "only this once", or how you feel anger in heart for another person, and so on. We need to let "Jesus take the wheel" and not Satan

Thank God that we had a mother that shared her stories, her encounters with God with us and that we knew to Pray the Rosary that Mary would intercede for our protection. I cant imagine what would have happened had we not had someone to help us grow in our Faith and relationship with God!

And as I'm writing this down on paper, a thought just occurred...after we prayed the Rosary so hard, we didn't have any more issues with the board. Wow, the power of the Rosary & Mary against Satan!
